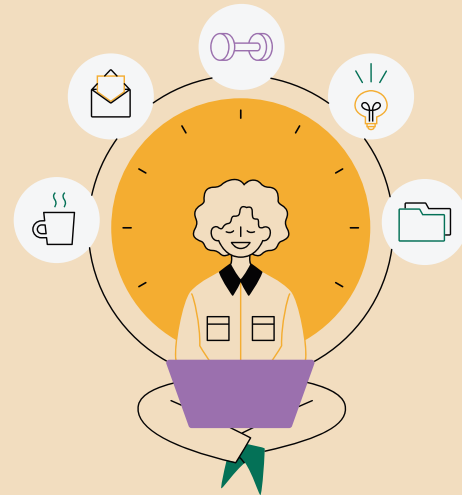
Things to Teach Your Child about Online Safety Today!

1 Protect Personal Information

- Never share your full name, address, phone number, name of your school, or passwords online.
- Keep social media accounts private.
- Use a strong password and never share it with friends.
- Decline optional cookies.



2 Strangers are NOT friends

- Don't talk to people you don't know in real life.
- Confirm that someone is who they say they are by asking a personal detail.
- Never agree to meet someone from the internet.
- Be cautious of fake profiles and online predators.
- Block and report suspicious accounts and contacts.
- Never send risky pictures to anyone.

5 If it's too good to be true....

- Don't click on suspicious links or emails from unknown senders.
- Learn what clickbait is and how to avoid clicking on tempting sites.
- Avoid downloading files or apps from untrusted sources.
- Never install extensions without permission.
- If an offer seems too good to be true, it probably is a scam, like winning a free iPad!

3 No Online Bullying

- If someone is mean or threatening, don't respond—block and report them.
- Always tell a trusted adult if you feel uncomfortable or unsafe.
- Don't be a bully—treat others with kindness and respect.
- Never say or send something in writing that you wouldn't want your parents, your family, your friends and your school to see.

4 Social Media is Risky

- Think before you post—once it's online, it's hard to delete.
- Do not post personal or embarrassing photos of yourself and others.
- Understand the risks of popular apps and their privacy settings. Review these together with your parents.
- Do not accept friend requests from strangers
- Report and block if needed.
- If something online makes you uncomfortable, tell a parent, teacher, or another trusted adult.
- Learn how to report content that makes you feel bad on platforms like YouTube, TikTok, Snap Chat and Instagram.

6 Protect Your Privacy

- Turn off location sharing in social media and gaming apps. For Snapchat, use Ghost Mode.
- Don't upload your own picture to create a profile.
- Be mindful of apps that request access to your camera, microphone, or location. Ask a parent BEFORE allowing this.
- Adhere to parental controls!
